## Millwood Buddies: A Staple in School Culture

Intertwined into the Advisory curriculum is our buddy system. In junior kindergarten students are paired with eighth graders, with whom they do crafts, read books, and have lunch throughout the year.



The middle/upper school students progress with their buddies, and when they graduate, their third grade buddies sing at their graduation. In sixth and seventh grade, students are peer mentors for fourth and fifth grades, respectively. The middle school students help the lower school students navigate through peer re-



lations, homework, and study skills. This culminates in a shadow day for 5th graders at the end of the year, so that the lower school students experience a day in the life of a middle school student.

### **Kindness Matters**

Second grade students read "A Little Spot of Kindness" to go along with building a classroom community. The students listened to the story, shared how they can show kindness in and out of school and created their own spot using watercolors. This topic is part of character building and is under the umbrella of Millwood's Big Ten and Round Square.





### **3rd Graders Explore the** Scientific Method

Young Scientists are a group of former educators who visited Millwood School to present in-school scientific lessons. The third graders participated in two activities where the scientific method was explored. They were able to observe, form a hypothesis, make a prediction, conduct an experiment, and finally analyze the results of those activities.



Students created and tested a hypothesis involving water traveling from cup to cup with yarn. Food coloring made the water easier to see. Another activity had the students working with a combination of school glue, laundry detergent, and water. Students enjoyed experimenting with what happened to the physical properties as more of the detergent and water were added. You can see that the students were inquisitive, engaged, and amazed at their outcomes!








The start of school found our 8th grade Design class designing, building and testing an Ankle/ Foot Orthosis as part of their PLTW Design and Modeling curriculum.

Bobcats worked in teams with a limited amount of materials and created successful prototypes of their design.


They demonstrated outstanding teamwork and ingenuity in their designs!

## **Round Square Trip Abroad**

Millwood School is proud to be one of 230 like-minded schools in 50 countries worldwide that connect and collaborate, offering world-class programs and experiences developing global competence, character, and confidence in our students. Round Square can only strengthen the character education program that has been a hallmark of Millwood's mission for 33 years. "Round Square schools share a commitment to character education and experiential learning built around six themes - our IDEALS - International Understanding, Democracy, Environmental Stewardship, Adventure, Leadership and Service."

Mr. Ryan traveled to Gordonstoun this past summer and met Richard Davey, Gordonstoun's Head of Upper School. This Scottish school is one of two original member schools where the Round Square



community and IDEALS originated. The goal of the visit was to see first-hand where this international community of schools began and find out how Gordonstoun implements the Round Square Program. Gordonstoun has seen many notable pupils over the years, including a young Prince Charles, the future Charles III of England, equipping them "for leadership and service in a democracy by helping them to prepare for life despite hardships, dangers, and emotions of the moment."



On Sunday, September 18, seven upper school students and three faculty members traveled to Oxford in England for the 53rd Round Square International Conference. The theme of the conference is, What Does it Mean to Take Less and Be More. During the first part of the week, the group stayed at Oxford University's Pembroke College, enjoying some sightseeing, followed by dinner and speakers from their host school. Students also attended the Opening



Ceremony at the New Theatre Oxford.

Over the next two days, students heard Keynote speakers share their experiences with "Living the RS IDEALS" and participated in student forums with fellow student leaders from around the world. Students had some downtime to compete in a selfie-based Discovery Dash Treasure Hunt around Oxford before returning to the theatre for a Cultural Performance. Our group also had the opportunity to revel in a Ceilidh dinner dance for their final evening in Oxford.

The students and faculty later traveled from Oxford to AKS Lytham in the North West of England. For the remainder of the conference, students participated in service activities



and outdoor adventures in Lytham and the Lake District, followed by dinner and musical performances. For the last few days of their trip abroad, Mr. Ryan joined them to act as their guide as they explored the sights of London. The group visited the Courtauld Gallery, the British Museum, Buckingham Palace, the Tower of London, the Houses of Parliament, the London Eye, Chelsea Football Club, and the Queen's Theatre in London's West End to see Phantom of the Opera. What an experience that our students and faculty will never forget!





## Millwood Student Spotlight: Leila Grace

Leila Grace, 11th grader at Millwood School, attended the Virginia Space Coast Scholars (VSCS) summer program in June 2022. The program was for High School Sophomores focusing on the science, engineering, and technology integral to current missions at NASA Wallops Flight Facility and the Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport. The free program, designed by the Virginia Space Grant Consortium (VSGC), in partnership with the STEM Education program affiliated with Old Dominion University Peninsula Center, inspired students who possess technical and/or scientific in-



terests and were motivated to learn about the many different opportunities that NASA offered.

The program featured two key elements. The first is a dynamic online science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) learning experience featuring five modules. Upon completion of the online program, top-performing scholars were invited to attend a seven-day residential Summer Academy at NASA Wallops Flight Facility on Wallops Island, VA, where scholars learned firsthand from NASA professionals and their partners about the latest, cutting-edge technologies and missions. Completing the online course did not guarantee a slot into

the Summer Academy, due to space and funding limitations. Students were informed by email if they were accepted for the summer academy, based off their overall course GPA.

Leila completed the rigorous academic modules while balancing her coursework at Millwood during her sophomore year. This past summer, only 1500 students from various schools in Virginia applied for the program. Based off her overall academic GPA for the program, Leila was one of the top 10% of applicants who was selected to the summer program. Students selected to attend

the summer stayed in the University of Eastern Shore dormitory. Students shared a college dorm room and their food allergies were addressed. Students spent their days at NASA Wallops Flight Facility working with mentors and NASA staff to develop a NASA scientific mission. Students had to be US citizens or legal permanent resident to attend the summer academy.

This was a great experience for Leila as she understood how spacecraft, rockets, and launch vehicles were designed and built and was able to learn about the latest advances in space technology. She highly recommends the program for Millwood students who want to understand the big picture of space exploration, and discover career opportunities in aviation and space.


## 2022 Golf Classic: Another "Hole in One"
